What is PRISM?

The Pediatric Regional Integrated Services Model (PRISM) is a regional model developed in partnership with Child and Youth Services, Health and Education. This unique model supports families in accessing screening, assessment and follow-up services for children with developmental delays or possible developmental delay.

Range of services

You may receive some or all of the following depending on needs identified and agreed upon:

- Developmental Screening – available at a variety of community agencies
- Discussion with Regional Case Coordinator at Central Intake to identify child/family needs
- Assessment of child's development
- Summary of recommendations to best support your child including strategies for home, school, community
- Multiagency sharing of information upon your consent
- Collaborative service planning and provision with all agencies involved. This may range from parent/caregiver education, group sessions, coaching to one on one treatment
- Ongoing Follow-up/Review
